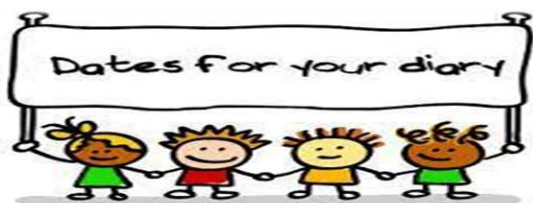

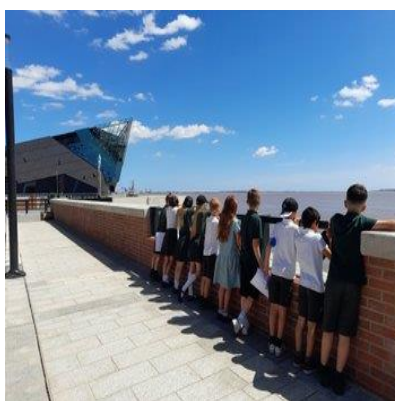

EYFS

In EYFS we have been learning all about different ways to create models, the children have been using split pins, treasury tags, staples and other methods of attaching material together to make a wide range of objects, from moving pictures to clocks and even musical instruments. We have been harvesting the vegetables we have grown over the year and talking all about the needs of certain plants and vegetables. The children have continued to do an amazing job in phonics and are more than ready to move on to the Year 1 curriculum. In maths we have been working hard to increase the speed of mental maths, we have been perfecting our counting in 2s, 5s, and 10, applying our knowledge of number to measurements.

Years 5 & 6

Year 5 have been working really hard on their computing project over the last few weeks as they have been using coding to create a game with different levels. The children in Year 6 have really been making the most of their last few weeks at Parkstone.
