- New play zones in KS2 outside area with specific sections for all toys/games etc., all areas will be colour coded. This will help with more structured playtimes and help with the transitions from KS1. There will also be a new canopy with benches underneath, for any quieter children to enjoy.
- The new KS1 playground will have its new play equipment installed on 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> December. It will be a progression of the jungle gym in the EYFS playground.
- New lockers have been installed in KS1 and KS2 for all the children to keep their belongings in. There will be slight adjustments made to where some of the lockers currently are placed to make more use of the space, but they have been a welcome addition to the school.
- The head explained what Gold awards are for new parents. Gold awards are certificates given out to 2 children from each class, the teacher keeps a record to ensure that every child receives one.
