This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. We are committed to increasing access for disabled pupils and supporting pupil with special educational needs. Our Accessibility Plan (<u>SEND | Parkstone Primary School</u>) provides details of how we will achieve this over a three-year period.

#### Time allocated per week for curriculum music

The National Plan for Music Education (NPME) recommend that schools timetable at least one hour each week of the school year for music throughout Key Stages 1 and 2.

We currently timetable:

- Key Stage 1 1 hour per week
- Key Stage 2 1 hour per week

#### Music curriculum

 Our music curriculum is informed by the <u>Model Music Curriculum</u> (March 2021), non-statutory guidance for teaching music from Key Stages 1 to 2.

#### Opportunities for pupils during lesson time

- As a school, we provide the following opportunities for pupils to learn to sing or play an instrument during lesson time:
  - Year 1/2 Tuned (boom whackers) and untuned percussion, sing songs in unison.
  - Year 3/4 Tuned (boom whackers and glockenspiels) and untuned percussion, sing songs in unison with a sense of melody
  - Year 5/6 Tuned (boom whackers and glockenspiels) and untuned percussion, sing songs in up to 3 parts, including simple harmony.

#### **Partnerships**

- Hull Music Hub support our music curriculum in the following ways:
  - Year 1/2 Djembe Drumming Workshop
  - Year 3/4 Whole Class Ensemble Teaching (weekly)

#### In the future
